The **New England Carpenters Union** has recently passed papers on the former laundry/spice factory located at 750 Dorchester Avenue. The union plans to convert the currently vacant facility to a multi-service training and resource center for its 25,000 members within its 31 locals. The facility will boast administrative offices, meeting rooms, classrooms, a branch of the union's own savings and loan as well as its own vision center. Union representatives are scheduled to come to the Association's May 20th meeting with further details.

Update on the Demolition of the Blessed Mother Teresa Rectory



At the February meeting, the membership voted unanimously to support the **Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston** in their proposal to the **Boston Landmarks Commission** to demolish the **Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta Rectory**. The demolition is to make way for a cafeteria, gym and performance center that would serve as an extension of a rehabilitated **Former Saint Margaret School**. This Association submitted a letter of support to the Landmarks Commission. The hearing was scheduled for this past Tuesday, March 11th. A BMTC representative will update us.
