Since 2006 resident permit parking has been posted and enforced on Buttonwood, Locust, Mayhew, Mount Vernon, Roseclair and Saint Margaret Streets. The four

hour enforcement period is from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Commuters from outside the neighborhood who formerly used these streets as free T parking, have now moved north to **Harvest, Dorset, Bellflower, Howell and Washburn Streets**, all of which remain without resident permit parking. Should We Seek CityRoots Help for the 5th Year

Every summer since 2006 the Polish Triangle neighborhood has been very fortunate to have been a recipient of the **Urban Ecology Institute's CityRoots** in-kind grants. CityRoots grants are used for green space enhancement and include materials and technical assistance. During the first three years, CityRoots guided us through the development of what has become **Sharon's Park**. This past summer, our CityRoots grant helped us design and develop the small pocket park on a sloped vacant lot at the intersection of Howell Washburn and Dorchester Avenue, which is now called **Paul's Triangle**.
